Originating from Madison's Mt. Zion Church, MTZ Charitable Organization has deep roots in the community. For over 110 years, Mt. Zion has played an unparalleled role in supporting people of color. The church has a reputation for boldly acknowledging and confronting the most critical issues people of color face. It is widely respected for its steadfast commitment to improve their quality of life. In addition, Mt. Zion has been an exemplary steward of its financial resources—case in point, quickly paying off the debt it incurred to build a new sanctuary in 2003.

Although Mt. Zion has always worked to serve the community beyond its walls, in 2021, the church decided to formalize this commitment by launching the MTZ Charitable Organization, Inc. We have deep Madison roots and a profound understanding of the needs and challenges our community faces. Creating this free-standing entity provided a way to support broader community needs. It also opened the door to new partnerships that ensure families receive the support they need without duplicating already available services.

At the heart of the MTZ Charitable mission is the belief that we can best help people of color by taking a wholefamily approach. Our efforts aren't limited by gender, age, or background. Instead, we work to understand and meet the needs of everyone, from young children to older adults, through inclusive, holistic services and support. We know the problems our community faces are complex and multifaceted, and we are committed to diving deep to address them.

Preparing our community for a brighter tomorrow

Our dedicated board, staff, and volunteers have worked together tirelessly to analyze current programs and determine the facility resources we need to do an even better job providing them for years to come. The design for our new Family Life Center is ADA-compliant and technologically advanced. It can easily be adapted to provide an evolving suite of programming and services and is designed with the needs of multi-generational community members in mind.

This new facility will give us ample space to deliver services in three important areas:



Educational programs

We believe in the power of lifelong learning, and our new facility will accommodate everyone from children to older adults.

Youth will benefit from our updated Academic Learning Center where we offer afterschool programming during the academic year and daily enrichment offerings during the summer months. Designed for children in grades K-5, these resources create community, build social skills, offer respite to parents, and improve academic performance.

Our T.R.Y. (Transforming and Reaching our Youth) program helps teens involved with the Juvenile Justice System find their way to a better future. Spaces designed with their needs in mind will allow us to provide a non-judgmental oasis of privacy and support. And thanks to our partnership with Dane County Human Services, we're able to mentor youth aging out of foster care and help them become successful adults.

And we haven't forgotten our adult learners. They'll be able to tap into healthy living and wellness classes and community education programs—plus, have a place to socialize and connect.



Health and wellness

To achieve true well-being, we must address our community's physical, emotional, and spiritual needs. We're excited that our new facility will let us expand our efforts in every area. Through our ongoing collaborations with local partners, community members can

turn to us for mental health resources and physical health services like flu and vaccination clinics. Our facility includes an indoor walking track, wellness equipment for all ages, and space to host high school basketball and volleyball games. This space will also house our new food pantry which will allow us to expand services to those in need of nutritious meals.




Community events
