VISION





MINISTRY GOAL 2

EMBRACE SYSTEMS OF OPERATIONS (EXODUS 18:1-27)

Purpose

The Bible teaches us to do everything decently and in order. When we create effective systems, this allows us to operate efficiently. Before COVID, we had a system for leadership. However, during COVID, many of our leaders were unable to serve. Therefore, new systems were created to fit the new leadership and the environment we were serving in. In 2023 we only achieved 90.22% of Operating Budget Income, 89.15% of Operating Budget Expense. We need the financial support of our entire membership in order to complete our financial obligations. Objectives


- We need to conduct a spiritual gifts assessment and skills assessment of our members.




